This resulted in territory taken from Mexico and a lot of brand new "citizens."


Chicanos that were now part of the USA were supposed to be considered as citizens that had the same rights as everyone else, but this did not happen.

Chicanos trying to appeal to the courts to keep their land were ignored and taken advantage of.


Interactions Now


8 56% of Chicanos say that they or their family has had some sort of interactions with the criminal justice system.



Trust


Trust in the criminal justice system from Chicanos has been on a slight increase, but there is still a large disparity between Chicanos and Anglos
