# State Normal School

N. D. SHOWALTER, PRESIDENT

CHENEY, WASHINGTON

April 1, 1916.

The Board of Trustees met in session at the Normal School offices April 1, 1916.

The question of the re-election of teachers for the next school year was taken up and Mr. Showalter was re-elected President of the Institution. Acting upon the recommendation of Mr. Showalter, the entire corps of teachers were re-elected together with the regular employees now serving the Institution. In connection with the election of teachers, the Trustees discussed at some length the salary situation, but financial conditions prevented any change being made at this time.

Mr. Geo. W. Frazier of Ypsilanti, Mich., was elected Assistant in the Department of Education at a salary of \$1500.00. Mr. Joseph D. Brodeur, of Worcester, Mass., was elected Head of the Music Department at a salary of \$1600.00. Supt. Putnam of Reardan was elected to assist in the Science Department for the Summer School Session at a salary of \$225.00 for the full time. Mr. Dales was elected to assist in the Manual Training Department for the Summer Session at a salary of \$225.00 for the full session.

Mr. Showalter was authorized to notify the newly elected teachers of the action of the Board and ask them to assure the Trustees of their acceptance.

Vouchers for the month were audited. Some applications were looked over but no action taken.

Mr. N. E. Hinch, Myra Pannebaker, and Mrs. Louise Anderson asked for a leave of absence during the Summer Session. These requests were granted.

Mr. Jordan and his attorney appeared before the Board with a bill for rent of a small house used at the time of the running of the Mohs-Miller Boarding Club. The Board of Trustees held that this was not a proper charge against the Normal School and no further action was taken.

Some discussion and thought was given to the financial budget for the coming year, but the matter was carried over to the next meeting.

Moved to adjourn.
