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

Structure Off West End of Main Dam Will Bo Part of Unequalled Plant of Stunning Capacities --

HE COLUMBIA BASIN PROJECT'S SECOND DAM AS STARTED ITS RISE.

IN OCT. 10 AN AMERICAN WHIRLEY UPSTREAM ROM THE WEST END OF GRAND COULEE DAM PLACED FIRST CONCRETE IN A WING DAM. THIS WAS THE FIRST DIRECT MOVE TOWARD THE PRIME PURPOSE OF THE PARENT DAM --- THE IRRIGATION OF OVER MILLION ACRES OF FERTILE THOUGH ARID LAND.

HE NO.2 DAM WILL BE A SUBSTANTIAL STRUC-TURE IN ITS OWN RIGHT AND YET WILL BE COM-PLETELY DWARFED IN SIZE BY THE PARENT. ONE IS TO BE 50 TIMES THE SIZE OF THE OTHER. AND YET THE SMALLER HAS NO PEER ON THE FACE OF THE GLOBE FOR WHAT IT WILL DO WHEN THE PLANT WHICH WILL BE INSTALLED BEHIND IT IS IN OPERATION.

0. 2 WILL BE THE WALL TO THE GRAND COU-LEE PUMPING PLANT AND WILL BE A TYPICAL CONCRETE DAM WITHOUT A SPILLWAY. IT WILL BE ABOUT 17 FEET THICK AT THE BASE, 35 FEET AT THE TOP; APPROXIMATELY 600 FEET LONG AND 237 FEET HIGH, AND WILL CONTAIN FROM 180,000 TO 200,000 YARDS OF CONCRETE. THE STRUC-TURE VILL BE COMPLETED NEXT SUMMER OR FALL. ON COMPLETION OF GRAND COULEE DAM MOST OF THE WING DAM WILL BE HIDDEN BENEATH WATERS

RAND COULEE DAM'S PROGENY, ANGLING TO SOUTH AND WEST FROM THE MAIN DAM, WILL BE OF TYPICAL CONSTRUCTION, WITH CONCRETE PLACED IN BLOCKS AND LIFTS AND WITH THE SAME BLOCK INSTALLATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS AS IN THE PARENT DAM. IT WILL CONTAIN STEEL-LINED INLET TUBES; GATES; DRAIN TILE; TECH-NICAL INSTRUMENTS; GROUT, DRAINAGE AND HOIST GALLERIES, AND WILL ALSO HAVE CRANE RAILS AND A ROADWAY ALONG THE CREST.

EVEDGING DOWN ONTO THE SLOPED BACK OF DAM WILL BE THE PUMPING PLANT PROPER. EXTENDING 40 FEET BEYOND THE TOP OF THE WING DAM PARAPET. HERE WILL BE THE MACHINE SHOP WITH ITS 75-TON CRANE, AND IN SUCCESS-IVE STEPS BELOW, A 5-TON CRANE STORAGE, TWO

THE DEMENT SILOS HAVE MAGIC UNLOADERS.

OPERATED BY REMOTE CONTROL, EACH OF
THE THREE BIG UNLOADERS CAN EMPTY A CARLOAD (230 BARRELS) OF CEMENT IN ABOUT 25
MINUTES. AN UNLOADER, WEIGHING APPROXIMATELY 8500 POUNDS, HAS A CAPACITY OF 450
BARRELS AN HOUR.

AN OPERATOR, STANDING BEHIND A MACHINE, DIRECTS THE ACTION OF THE MACHINE BY TILTING A DISK-LIKE SWITCH. THE SWITCH CONTAINS FOUR MERCURY SWITCHES, EACH RESEMBLING A LIGHT BULB. TILTING OF THE DISK FORWARD COMPLETES A CIRCUIT IN THE FORWARD BULB; THE MACHINE MOVES AHEAD. THE BACK SWITCH OPERATES BACKWARD. SWITCHES ALSO WORK TO THE RIGHT AND LEFT, OPERATING ONE WHEEL OF THE UNLOADER FORWARD AND THE OTHER BACKWARD FOR A SHORT RADIUS TURN. INTERMEDIATE TILTING CAUSES ONE WHEEL TO TURN, THE OTHER TO STOP, FOR A SHORT RADIUS.

#### WING DAM

150-TON CRANES FOR THE HANDLING OF PUMP MACHINERY, TWELVE 65,000 HORSE POWER MO-TORS AND THE TWELVE PUMPS THEMSELVES. INSIDE THE PLANT WILL BE BUS, PIPE AND CABLE GALLERIES ALSO.

HEN THE DUAL STRUCTURES ARE COMPLETED TO FORM A SINGLE PLANT, THE PLANT WILL BE APPROXIMATELY 600 FEET LONG, 1172 FEET WIDE, WITH A MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF 276 FEET OR APPROXIMATELY 20 STORIES. IT SHOULD BE REMEMBERED, HOWEVER, THAT CONSTRUCTION OF THE WING DAM AND ITS APPURTENANT FIXTURES IS ALL THAT IS PROVIDED FOR IN THE CBI CONTRACT. THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PUMPING PLANT PROPER OR INSTALLATION OF ITS MACHINERY.

INAL AND COMPLETE SPECIFICATIONS ARE NOT AVAILABLE ON MACHINERY OF THE PUMPING PLANT, BUT THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION HAS INFORMATION WHICH IS RATHER STUNNING----

BECAUSE THE IRRIGATION OF 1,200,000
AGRESSOF PARCHED LAND TAKES MORE THAN A
STREAM OF WATER, A PUMPING PLANT HERE MUST
BE ABLE TO DIVERT A RIVER OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES. CONSEQUENTLY, WHEN
GRAND COULEE DAM'S PUMPS ARE ALL INSTALLED
THEY WILL BE SO LARGE THAT ONLY TWO OF THE
WORLD'S LARGEST HYDRO-ELECTRIC POWER PLANTS
TODAY COULD OPERATE ALL OF THEM. THE TWO
PLANTS ARE AT BOULDER DAM AND DNIEPER DAM
(RUSSIA).

HE GRAND COULEE PUMPING PLANT WILL CONTAIN TWELVE PUMPS; TWO WILL BE SPARES. THE CAPACITY WILL BE ENOUGH TO EMPTY PRACTICALLY ANY OF THE LARGEST RIVERS IN THE NATION, ESPECIALLY DURING THEIR LOW SEASON. THE COLUMBIA ITSELF, SECOND LARGEST RIVER IN THE UNITED STATES, COULD HAVE BEEN EMPTIED BY PUMPS OF SIMILAR CAPACITY DURING ONE OF ITS LOW SEASONS. THE SAME PUMP CAPACITY WOULD BE SUFFICIENT TO SUPPLY THE UNITED STATES WITH ALL ITS DOMESTIC WATER; 28 HOURS OF PUMPING COULD HAVE SUPPLIED THE CITY OF SPOKANE WITH ALL THE WATER IT USED DURING THE YEAR 1938, THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION EXPLAINS.

SINGLE PUMP WILL HAVE THE CAPACITY OF LIFTING 50 TONS OF WATER PER SECOND AND WILL DELIVER MORE THAN A BILLION GALLONS


OF WATER IN A DAY, ENOUGH FOR 7 MILLION PEOPLE. IT WILL BE ABLE TO ELEVATE WATER INTO THE STORAGE RESERVOIR IN GRAND COULEE FOR THE IRRIGATION OF 120,000 ACRES OF LAND. A PUMP WITH ONLY HALF THE CAPACITY WOULD HAVE BEEN ABLE TO EMPTY THE COLORADO RIVER AT BOULDER DAM DURING THE LOW SEASON.

ND YET ONLY ABOUT ONE-EIGHTEENTH OF THE AVERAGE RUN-OFF AT GRAND COULEE DAM WILL BE REQUIRED FOR IRRIGATION, THE USBR CALCULATES, AND THAT WILL BE TAKEN FROM THE FLOOD-WATER OF THE RIVER. DURING THE PEAK FLOW MONTHS OF JUNE AND JULY THE PUMPING PLANT AT FULL CAPACITY WOULD DIVERT ONLY ONE-SEVENTEENTH OF THE AVERAGE FLOW.

HE GRAND COULEE DAM PUMPING PLANT WILL REQUIRE ONLY ONE-FOURTH THE OUTPUT OF THE POWER PLANT, WHICH WILL GENERATE ITS POWER ENTIRELY FROM THE COLUMBIA RIVER: EACH PUMP WILL HAVE A 65,000 HORSE POWER, 13,800-VOLT SYNCHRONOUS MOTOR. TWO MOTORS WILL BE FURNISHED POWER FROM ONE GENERATOR IN THE POWER PLANT. THE GENERATOR AND MOTOR SPEEDS WILL BE ADJUSTABLE TO THE MOST EFFICIENT SPEEDS AT VARIOUS HEADS. ORDIN-ARILY PUMPING WILL BE AGAINST A 280' HEAD, FROM A FULL STORAGE RESERVOIR (EL. 1290) TO A FULL BALANCING RESERVOIR (EL. 1570) IN THE GRAND COULEE. CAPACITIES ARE FIGURED FOR A NORMAL HEAD.

LAST MONDAY AFTERNOON THE SEVEN YEAR OLD SON OF C.M. CALLAHAN, C. B. I. MECHANIC, LOST THREE FINGERS OF HIS LEFT HAND WHEN HE DROVE A NAIL INTO AN OLD BLASTING CAP. APPARENTLY THIS CAP WAS FOUND BY THE YOUNGSTER SOMEWHERE NEAR HIS HOME AND HE WAS ATTEMPTING TO MAKE A WHISTLE OF IT. THE CAP THAT CAUSED MONDAY'S ACCIDENT WAS OF THE OPEN-END TYPE FOR USE WITH A FUSE. INVESTIGATION HAS DISCLOSED THAT IT WAS BROUGHT INTO THIS COMMUNITY BY A WORKMAN FROM ARIZONA. THIS IS A VIVID EXAMPLE OF HOW FAR THESE ARTICLES SOMETIMES STRAY FROM THE POINT OF INTENDED USE.

THIS SAME ACCIDENT MIGHT HAVE HAPPENED TO ANY CHILD IN THE COMMUNITY. THE CHILDREN CAN HARDLY BE EDUCATED TO

REALIZE THE DANGER OF HANDLING EXPLOSIVES.
THEREFORE, IT IS THE DUTY OF EVERY GROWN
PERSON IN THE COMMUNITY TO PROTECT THE
CHILDREN FROM THIS HAZARD. IF ANYONE KNOWS
OF EXPLOSIVES IN ANY FORM NOW IN A RESIDENTIAL AREA, THE STATE OR CITY AUTHORITIES
SHOULD BE NOTIFIED IMMEDIATELY. THE SAFETY
DEPARTMENT OF C.B.I. WILL BE GLAD TO REMOVE

PUMPS WILL PASS THROUGH 12 14-FOOT DIAMETER TUNNELS OR INLETS IN THE WING DAM TO THE PUMPS AND THEN UPWARD THROUGH CONDUITS 13 EVET IN DIAMETER AND FROM 680 TO 800 FEET LONG, FINALLY SPILLING INTO THE BALANCING RESERVOIR 1.7 MILES AWAY IN THE COULEE. THE INLET TUNNELS WILL BE LINED WITH STEEL BY WESTERN PIPE & STEEL COMPANY. THE PORTALS OF THE OTHER CONDUITS, VISIBLE TO THE EAST, ARE 22 FEET IN DIAMETER BUT NARROW TO 17 FEET. THESE WILL BE STEEL-LINED AND WILL BE SET IN CONCRETE.

EARS AGO PLANS ONCE GIVEN SOME CONSIDERATION INCLUDED THE BUILDING OF A
PLANT 180 FEET WIDE AND 790 FEET LONG,
TO BE AT RIGHT ANGLES UPSTREAM TO THE
MAIN DAM. THIS PLANT WOULD HAVE CONTAINED 20 UNITS, EACH OF FOUR PUMPS, A
TOTAL OF 80 PUMPS. EACH UNIT WOULD HAVE
REQUIRED A 33,000 HORSE POWER MOTOR AND
WOULD HAVE FORCED WATER THROUGH PIPES 10
FEET IN DIAMETER.



A watch needs cleaning and adjusting because the oil usually loses its lubricating qualities after a year and leaves only a gummy residue, which must be thoroughly cleaned before fresh oil is applied; then the watch is adjusted to time.

IT MAY BE INTERESTING TO KNOW THAT THE AVERAGE WATCH CONTAINS ABOUT 210 PARTS, ABOUT ONE-THIRD OF WHICH IS SCREWS. THE STEEL USED FOR HAIRSPRINGS COSTS ABOUT \$5.00 PER POUND; THE POUND MAKES ABOUT EIGHT MILES OF HAIRSPRING WIRE AND IS WORTH \$62,000. THE DRILLS USED TO MAKE THE BALANCE WHEEL ARE ACTUALLY FINER THAN A HUMAN HAIR; THE SCALES USED TO WEIGH SCREWS FOR THESE HOLES ARE SO ACCURATE THEY WILL WEIGH A PENCIL MARK OR A HALF-THOUSANDTH OF A GRAIN. IT REQUIRES 3773 OPERATIONS TO MAKE A WATCH AND THE TIME REQUIRED FOR THE PROCESS, ABOUT ONE YEAR.

SO STOP AND THINK - ONE CARELESS MOMENT MAY DESTROY THE EFFICIENCY OF ALL THIS TIME AND EFFORT; SO TRY TO GIVE YOUR WATCH THE CARE AND SERVICE IT DESERVES FOR VALUE RECEIVED.


