

THESE OPERATING ENGINEERS

T TAKES ONLY A SLIGHT PROJECTION INTO
THE FUTURE TO VISUALIZE THE COMPLETED
GRAND COULEE DAM -- ACTIVE MONUMENT TO THE
BENEFIT OF FUTURE MILLIONS OF PEOPLE.
THIS BRINGS REALIZATION THAT, WITH MEMORY
AS FLEETING AS IT IS, THE FINISHED DAM
WILL FURTHER TEND TO OBSCURE DETAILS IN
ITS CONSTRUCTION. CONTRIBUTORY TO COMPLETION WAS THE UNREELING AND REELING OF
CABLE ON CRANE DRUMS FOR NEARLY ONE-HALF
MILLION MILES AS CONCRETE BUCKETS WERE
LOWERED, DUMPED, RAISED. WITH EACH BUCKET, THE DAM ADDED AN INFINITESIMAL BUT
REAL FRACTION TO ITS SIZE.

OPERATORS. A SPECIAL DIVISION OF OPERATORS INCLUDES SIGNALMEN, DIESAL-ELECTRIC LOCOMOTIVE OPERATORS AND BRAKEMEN.

RIGINALLY IN THE EMPLOYMENT OF OPERA-TORS THE COMPANY NOTIFIED THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR OF NEED FOR AN OPERA-TOR FOR A WHIRLEY, HAMMERHEAD OR STIFFLEG CRANE. 

CRANES. IN MOST CASES THESE PARTICULAR OPERATORS CAN BE CALLED SPECIALISTS IN THE OPERATION OF WHIRLEY CRANES—OPERATORS WHO UNDERSTAND AND CAN ACT FOR PROBLEMS PECULIAR TO WHARLEYS. ASSIGNMENT TO HAMMERHEAD CRANES MAY BE TO OPERATORS WHO HAVE WORKED ON BOTH TYPES OF CRANES OR ON HAMMERHEADS ALONE. BASIC PROBLEMS IN OPERATION OF A HAMMERHEAD ARE FEWER. OPERATORS DETAILED TO STIFFLEGS USUALLY ARE VETERANS WITH YEARS OF EXPERIENCE.

E ARE NOT SO MUCH CONCERNED HERE WITH THE FACT THAT AN ENGINEER MUST PUSH THIS OR THAT PARTICULAR LEVER IN ORDER FOR CRANE TO OPERATE IN THIS OR THAT WAY SO MUCH AS THAT HE MUST OPERATE A PARTICULAR KIND OF CRANE SAFELY AND EFFICIENTLY. WHEN HE BRINGS ABOUT THESE RESULTS THERE A RHYTHM TO THE WORK THAT IS REMARKABLE TO WATCH. A GOOD WHIRLEY OPERATOR, IN CASES UNABLE TO SEE THE DESTINATION FOR HIS LOAD, CAN MAKE MUCH OF HIS WORK DOVE-TAIL AS IN A SINGLE ACTION. THE BOOM OF THE RIG WILL SWING UP OR DOWN TO GET PROP-ER DISTANCE FOR THE JOB AT HAND, FIRST TO PICK UP A CONCRETE BUCKET, FOR EXAMPLE, AND THEN TO SWING IN AN ARC TO GET LOAD AWAY FROM THE TRACK AND SPOTTED

THE BLOCK BELOW. AS THE CABLE IS UNREEL-ING, THE CRANE MAY BE TRAVELING SLOWLY ALONG THE TRESTLE.

N THE OPERATION OF A HAMMERHEAD, PRO3-LEMS OF A WHIRLING BOOM ARE NATURALLY RE-MOVED. INEFFICIENCY IN RACKING IN OR OUT WITH A LOAD, HOWEVER, OR HESITANT TRAVEL ALONG THE RAILS AT THE SAME TIME WOULD BE DANGEROUS TO MEN AND EQUIPMENT.

ALTHOUGH ONE IMPORTANT TEST FOR A CRANE OPERATOR IS HIS AGILITY IN PLACING AN EMP-TY BUCKET ONTO A CAR WITHOUT DAMAGE AFTER A DINKEY OPERATOR ASSISTS BY SPOTTING THE CAR, THE HEIGHT OF DIFFICULTY COMES IT IS DIFFICULT FOR WITH A STIFFLEG. ANY CRANE TO SO LIMIT THE SWING OF EMPTY BUCKET THAT AN OPERATOR CAN ALWAYS TIME AND CONTROL THE BUCKET SUFFICIENTLY BY QUICKLY EASING IT INTO PLACE, WITH THE HIGH UNWIELDY BOOM OF A STIFFLEG - UP TO 148 FEET LONG -- THE DIFFICULTY IS IN-CREASED. IN HANDLING CONCRETE THE BOOM MUST OFTEN BE LOW TO PICK UP A BUCKET, HIGH TO PLACE IT AND LOW TO RETURN THE EMPTY. A FLAT OR LOW BOOM PLACES THE BUCKET A LONG WAY FROM THE OPERATOR. ANOTHER THING TOO IS THAT THE HIGH DEGREE OF AUTOMATIC TROL FOUND IN TRAVERSE CRANES IS SOMEWHAT (CONTINUED ON PAGE 5)

LACKING IN THE STIFFLEGS WHICH HAVE FRICTION DRIVES -- A WIDE VARIETY OF LONG LEVERS TO SHIFT IN SERIES.

VALUABLE ASSISTANT TO EACH OF THESE CRANE OPERATORS IS HIS "EYES", A SIGNALMAN ("BELLBOY") WITH HIS TELEPHONE HEADSET, COMMUNICATING TO HIS CRANE OPERATOR FROM THE SCENE WHERE THE CONCRETE, SKIP, LUMBER, SMALL BUILDING, PIECES OF STEEL OR THE LIKE IS TO BE PLACED. THE VOICE OF THE SIGNALMAN AS HEARD BY HIS OPERATOR IN THE CRANE CAB IS AN IMPORTANT SAFETY MEASURE FOR MEN AND EQUIPMENT.

URING PEAK PRODUCTION APPROXIMATELY
50 CRANE OPERATORS HAVE BEEN NEEDED DURING A WEEK OF OPERATION, 70 "DINKEY" SKINNERS, 50 SIGNALMEN. WORK THEN REQUIRED
THREE 265-TON HAMMERHEAD CRANES, FOUR
SLIGHTLY SMALLER HAMMERHEAD CRANES, TWO
CLYDE WHIRLEYS, THREE AMERICAN WHIRLEYS
AND SOME USE OF THREE STIFFLEG CRANES.
EIGHTEEN LOCOMOTIVES WERE NEEDED FOR
CONCRETING DURING THE PEAK DAYS.

ODAY AND UNTIL RESUMPTION OF SPRING CONCRETING A PROBLEM IS TO DISTRIBUTE AS MUCH TIME AS POSSIBLE AMONG OPERATORS. RESULTS OF RECLAMATION PROGRAM

(FROM A PRESENTATION BY JOHN C. PAGE, COMMISSIONER OF THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION, AT THE EIGHTH ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE RECLAMATION BUREAU, DENVER, LAST NOVEMBER).

"... | COULD TELL YOU, FOR EXAMPLE, THAT IN 37 YEARS UNDER THE FEDERAL RECLAMATION PROGRAM WE HAVE CONSTRUCTED ON A REIMBUR-SABLE BASIS 156 DAMS AND 48 POWER HOUSES : THAT THE POWER HOUSES PRODUCED MORE THAN 2 BILLION, 212 MILLION KILOWATT HOURS' OF ENERGY LAST YEAR WHICH SOLD FOR \$5.610:847. 14; THAT 903,897 PEOPLE LIVE ON 52,552 FARMS, IN 258 TOWNS AND CITIES WE HAVE CREATED BY IRRIGATION, AND THAT THESE PEO-PLE HAD ON DEPOSIT I'N BANKS LAST YEAR \$226,645,573; THAT 3,040,695 ACRES WERE IRRIGATED BY FEDERAL CANALS, AND LAST'YEAR PRODUCED CROPS VALUED AT \$113,463,460, OR \$37.31 PER ACRE. WITHOUT COMPARISONS OR INTERPRETATIONS, HOWEVER, THESE BARE FACTS WOULD MEAN LITTLE. "

THE NETWORK OF DAMS BUILT BY THE USBR IN THE WESTERN STATES, HE EXPLAINED, PRO-VIDED WATER TO IRRIGATE THE FARMS WHICH SUPPORTED NEARLY ONE-TWELFTH OF THE RURAL

AND URBAN POPULATION OF THE WEST AND FURNISHED POWER FOR USE ON THE FARMS AND IN THE HOMES OF ABOUT ONE-FOURTH OF THE WEST'S PEOPLE. DEPOSITS IN BANKS WHICH NEVER WOULD OR COULD HAVE OPENED WITHOUT CONSTRUCTION OF THESE PROJECTS, HE ADDED, LAST YEAR CAME PRETTY CLOSE TO EQUALLING THE COST OF CONSTRUCTION OF ALL THE OPERATING FEDERAL PROJECTS. CONSTRUCTION OF THESE PROJECTS IS REPAYABLE TO THE UNITED STATES, HE EXPLAINED, AND MORE THAN \$50,000,000 HAS BEEN REPAID.

"LET US SAY THAT THE RAW CROPS PRODUCED ON THE LANDS WE IRRIGATED REPRESENTED A CONTRIBUTION TO THE NATIONAL WEALTH LAST YEAR ALONE OF MORE THAN 113 MILLION DOLLARS, AND THAT THE PER ACRE RETURN TO THE FARMER ON OUR PROJECTS WAS CONSIDERABLY MORE THAN TWICE THE NATIONAL AVERAGE."


