MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

THE Board of Trustees met at the home of Mr. R. T. Hargreaves at 6:30 P. M., Thursday, August 3, 1933. Present: Richard S. Munter, Joel E. Ferris, James P. Dillard, and R. T. Hargreaves.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE: Mr. Ralph K. Allen's request for a leave of absence (without pay) from September 1933 to June 1934 was granted.

Mr. and Mrs. Daryl D. Dayton's request for a leave of absence (without pay) to study in Germany was granted to begin to the end of the fall quarter, December 11, 1933.

NURSE: On recommendation of Mr. Hargreaves Miss Dorothy Prindle was appointed to fill the leave of absence of Miss Charlotte Diener beginning in September, 1933.

N. R. A.: Mr. Hargreaves reported that he had received a Certificate of Compliance for the National Recovery Administration. The matter was discussed but no action was taken because it was felt that the school comes practically within the provisions of the agreement and is a non-profit organization and is limited in what it can do by budget appropriation.

TRAINING SCHOOL: Mr. Hargreaves reported that he talked to Mr. C. W. Greenough, member of the President's Public Works Board for Washington, about the possibility of securing funds for a Training School. Mr. Greenough said that he was in hearty sympathy with the request of the Board but as yet knew very little about the conditions, as the Board had not yet met, but if it were at all possible he would support the efforts of the Normal School to secure such a building out of available funds. He suggested that Mr. Hargreaves write to each member of the Board a statement of the request.
