MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees met for luncheon at the Davenport Hotel, Tuesday, September 12th, 1933.

Present: Mr. Richard S. Munter, Mr. James P. Dillard, Mr. Joel E. Ferris, and Mr. R. T. Hargreaves.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.


BUILDING: Mr. Hargreaves reported that he had talked with the three members of the Federal Public Works Board for the State, Mr. C. W. Greenough, Mr. LeRoy LaFollette and Mr. William Thompson, and they had all expressed themselves as willing to support financially our application for government aid in the building of a training school. He had an interview with Mr. Dana, Regional Director, in Portland, Oregon on August 19th, 1933.

On Monday of this week Mr. Hargreaves talked with Governor Martin. The Governor said he intended to propose a building program for the Educational Institution of approximately \$1,000,000 to be financed out of the \$10,000,000 Bond Issue. He had in mind \$150,000 of State Funds and the securing of \$50,000 or 25% from the Federal Public Works Board for Cheney, making a total of \$200,000.

After some discussion it was decided to have plans drawn for the training school building and the estimates prepared. Mr. George Rasque and Mr. Charles I. Carpenter were chosen as the architects; the former to be the chief architect and the latter to be his associate, the architects fees to be five per cent. It was understood that in the event that the building should not be built the architects would be paid only for their labor and their plans.

The meeting adjourned at 1:20.
