MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees met in the Davenport Hotel, Thursday, October 3rd, 1935 at eight o'clock. Present: Richard S. Munter, James P. Dillard, Joel E. Ferris, H. N. Stronach and R. T. Hargreaves.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.


RIFLE RANGE: The request of the American Legion post of Cheney to use the playroom in the Training School as a rifle range for a junior rifle corps, was denied by unanimous vote.

BUILDINGS: Mr. Stronach brought up the matter of clearing the block on which the new training school is to be built of the vacant houses. After some discussion, the Board voted to ask for bids on the houses and to sell them to the best bidder. Mr. Stronach was instructed to insert an ad in the Cheney Press.

TRAINING SCHOOL BUILDING: The real purpose of the meeting was to get a personal report from the architects, Mr. Rasque and Mr. Carpenter, on the status of the training school plans. Unfortunately, Mr. Rasque who had gone to Walla Walla failed to get back to the meeting due to automobile trouble. The Board asked Mr. Carpenter who was present for a report. He said that the structural part of the plans which were his special charge could be completed within three weeks. The Board expressed some concern over the delay in completion of the plans and advised the architects that they wished to have these plans out this month, because it seems apparent, that the projects that are ready for bids in November will be in a favored position.

CONDUIT SYSTEM: Mr. Carpenter reported on the plans to date for the conduit system. The Board advised him to discontinue work on the conduit system and direct all of his efforts to getting out the plans for the training school.

The meeting adjourned at 9:25.
