The Board of Trustees met at 11:00 a.m., Tuesday, February 23, 1954, in the President's office of the college. Those present were: J. Harold Anderson, chairman; Mr. Charles A. Gonser and Mrs. Frank Laughbon, members; Dr. W. W. Force, secretary; and Dr. Raymond M. Mosher, president of the college.

MINUTES

The minutes for the meeting of January 9, 1954, were read and approved.

CHANGES IN STATUS

The Board approved the designation of <u>G. Jerome</u> <u>Stickney</u>, registrar, as assistant director of the summer school at a salary of \$500 for the session.

The Board approved the promotion from part-time instructor to full-time instructor for Opal Fleckenstein, Department of Art, at a salary of \$4000 for ten months, effective at the beginning of the spring quarter.

The Board approved the appointment of <u>Camilla Surbeck</u> as temporary instructor, College Elementary School, for the remaining five months, at a salary of \$425 per month, effective February 1, 1954.

The Board approved an increase of \$33.44 for <u>Stanley Hendricks</u>, fireman, who returned to the staff after a leave of absence for military duty, this increase being the amount granted other members of the maintenance staff during the time Mr. Hendricks was on leave.

REEMPLOYMENT

The Board approved the application of <u>Loyd W. Vande-Berg</u>, former assistant professor of industrial arts, for reemployment following his resignation last fall to accept another position. His rank and salary were approved as assistant professor at \$4700, effective September, 1954.

No action was taken on the requests for reemployment by <u>George Wallace</u>, former registrar and professor of education, resigned, and <u>Wilfred Beard</u>, former instructor in physical education, resigned.

EMERITUS TITLE FOR OTIS W. FREEMAN

The Board approved the request of <u>Dr. Otis W. Freeman</u>, resigned, that the title of "President Emeritus; Professor of Geography and Geology" be conferred upon him and carried in future editions of the catalog.

HEARING OF THOS. P. HOWARD, BSEIU REPRESENTATIVE

Mr. Thomas P. Howard, representative of the Building Service Employees International Union, presented the attached request to the Board and made a brief statement in its behalf. The Board directed that a comparative study of the wages paid to the dining hall employees be made by the comptroller and the report and recommendations concerning the salaries be submitted at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees.

PLANS FOR STUDENT UNION BUILDING

Don Childress, president of the Associated Student Body, Kenneth Garvey, and Mr. Haas, faculty adviser of the ASB, presented plans for a student union building. It was moved and seconded that the Board of Trustees approve in principle plans as presented and direct that a complete investigation of the plans relative to costs, possible income, financing,

et cetera, be made and presented to the Board for final approval. Motion carried.

REPORT ON JUNIOR COLLEGE DEVELOPMENT

Mr. Louis V. Grafious, liaison representative from this college, made a brief statement in regard to the projected junior college branch of this institution to be established in Spokane. He stated that in his opinion the junior college branch is an opportunity to serve Spokane in a capacity which is the responsibility of the college and which will develop the on-campus enrollment by guiding students into the upper division of the college. The Board gave its approval to the program.

ISLE MEMORIAL ROSE GARDEN

A memorial rose garden honoring Dr. Walter W. Isle, the late president of EWCE, was approved, a detailed plan of which shall be presented at a later date.

TRAVEL REQUEST

The Board approved the request of Mr. Francis J. Schadegg to attend a meeting of the National Council of Geography Teachers in San Francisco, August 20-21, under conditions which prevail governing travel, namely, transportation reimbursement but no per diem allowance.

RESIGNATION

The Board accepted the resignation of <u>Arletta</u>
<u>Rasmussen</u> as secretary in the office of the Director of
<u>Public Relations</u> and approved the appointment of Mrs.
<u>Barbara Gower</u> as a replacement at a salary of \$160 per
month, effective as of February 19.
