## MINUTES FOR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Eastern Washington College of Education  
Roosevelt Hotel, Seattle, 8:30 a.m., Wednesday  
October 20, 1954

The Board of Trustees of Eastern Washington College of Education met in regular session in the Roosevelt Hotel, Seattle, at 8:30 a.m., Wednesday, October 20, 1954. The following were present: J. Harold Anderson, chairman; Charles A. Gonser and Mrs. Frank Laughbon, members; and Dr. Don S. Patterson, president of the college.

### MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting for September 18, 1954, were read, amended and approved.

### INVESTMENT OF RESIDENCE HALLS FUNDS

A report from the comptroller that the cash balance in the Halls of Residence Funds would permit the investment of \$40,000 was considered and it was moved and seconded that the following investments be made:

One-half, or \$20,000, in federal funds  
One-half, or \$20,000, in savings and loan associations,  
with no deposit in any one savings and loan association  
to exceed \$10,000

Motion carried.

### ESTABLISHMENT OF POLITICAL CLUBS

The request for the establishment of political clubs on the Eastern Washington College of Education campus was discussed. The discussion indicated that such clubs could be established, to operate with certain understandings and under certain regulations. It should be known that such groups are not sponsored by the college, that no rallies of a political nature are to be held on the campus, and that no off-campus speakers are to be brought to a club meeting on the campus. Official action on such requests was postponed until action is taken by the joint boards of the colleges of education.



## NEW APPOINTMENTS

John Sherwin, physics and mathematics, at \$40 per month

Don Gerimonte radio station KEWC, at \$80 per month

Lois Speer, assistant nurse, fall quarter, at \$250 per month

A letter from the State Department of Education was read which conveyed the information that the State Board of Education had approved the teacher education program for Eastern Washington College of Education.


## HOUSING FOR MARRIED STUDENTS
