Dr. Patterson presented a request for consideration of the establishment of Greek houses on the campus. The proposal was discussed but no action was taken.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Dr. Patterson informed the board that the date for opening of bids on the food center had been set for 3:00 p.m., April 25, in the Davenport Hotel, Spokane. Mr. Johns explained the necessity to move fast on getting the food center under way.

Dr. Patterson read to the board a letter received from the president of the Associated Students at the University of Washington in regard to the action taken by the board with respect to speakers on the campus.

The college has been presented with a bill from the architects on the food center, Funk, Murray and Johnson, for costs of redesigning the center. The chairman suggested that Mr. Funk be present at the next meeting of the board.

Mr. Johns reported on the purchase of treasury bills in the amount of \$66, 046.59, maturing on October 11, 1962, which will yield 2.814% interest. This will bring in revenue of \$953.41.

Dr. Patterson reported on sick leave with pay which had been granted to Mr. Russell Smith, Assistant Professor of Business Education, for the spring quarter of 1961-62.
