New York Oct 23, 1918

My dear Mother:

Have been as busy as a dog that chases his tail ever since getting here. There are more things to attend to than I can tell you about now.

This afternoon we are going to Columbia University to take a week's training. We will be quartered there in one of their dormitories.

When you write or send mail address Y.M.C.A. 347 Madison Avenue, New York city and I will get it all right.

I am sure that I will not be leaving before the end of next week.

I will have a little leisure after the middle of next week and then I will try to find a coat for Betty. However you need not say anything to her about it. Maybe I would disappoint her.

I left my razor strap hanging on the closet door in my room. I wish you would parcel post it to me. I will write again when I get a little more time.
