ABOUT TODAY'S GAME

This is the first meeting in football between Eastern and Western Montana. The two met in basketball last year.

The Bulldogs, from Dillon, have a new coach and 11 lettermen. The new coach is Don Keltz, who came to Dillon from Broadwater County High School in Townsend, Mont., where he had an outstanding 64-10 record.

Keltz is in his first year as a college coach, but the Western Montana staff is not entirely new. Cecil Kent, the assistant coach who handles the line, remains, and the Bulldogs have Dick Maroney as a graduate assistant.

The Bulldogs, who play in the Montana Collegiate Conference where they finished third last year, are a young team but have some outstanding players. Among them are Spokaneite Wayne Christensen, left end, who was all-conference last year, and Stan Chalich, another Spokane player, who is a sophomore corner backer for the Bulldogs.

Western Montana is a school of only 750 students, but with a football team comparable to that turned out by schools many times its size.

For Eastern, today's game will likely provide an answer to the Savages' chances in the Evergreen Conference. Ever optimistic, Eastern coach Dave Holmes believes this is the best team he has had in his three years at Eastern, and he and his staff have their sights set on a conference championship.

Eastern's Mel Stanton probably holds the key, more than any other one player, to the Savages' success. If Stanton is well and can run, behind excellent blocking of an almost all-veteran squad, it could mean a successful season. Stanton, of course, isn't the only Eastern ground gainer. Not to be overlooked are Don Strate and Ron Uhl. Uhl has taken over Dean Adams' flanker spot, as Adams has been moved to defense. Ends Dave Hansen and Joe Mosebar are expected to provide the basis for Eastern's aerial attack.

1965 PROSPECTS

One of the strongest squads in recent Savage history promises to provide a second successive winning season for coach Dave Holmes and his staff. Seventeen lettermen form the nucleus of what appears to be a strong contender for the Evergreen Conference title.

Only five lettermen are missing from last year's team which tied for second place in the conference with a 4-3 record and finished the season with an overall 5-4 record. Returning lettermen are expected to replace all of these losses with the exception of a kicker of proven ability.

Eastern's running game is expected to be one of the best in the small college ranks of the Northwest with the return of last year's all-state small college back-of-the-year Mel Stanton; senior letterman Ron Uhl; junior letterman and all-conference nominee Don Strate and sophomore letterman Dick Zornes. Stanton, who averaged 88 yards per game last year and was ranked 14th nationally among small college rushers, should gain national recognition this year with his running ability.

Sophomore letterman quarterback George Cross moved into the starting role during the latter part of the 1964 season and is expected to retain that position this year.

An all-lettermen line led by senior guards Steve Hecker and Roger Schjeldahl is expected to provide the running attack with one of the best forward walls in the area. However, adequate reserve strength must be found from among the 45 freshmen and transfers on the squad.

The Savages will play their home games in Joe Albi Memorial Stadium in Spokane this year as their home gridiron, Woodward Field, is the site of the new John F. Kennedy Memorial Library which is now under construction.



MEL STANTON, who averaged more than 88 yards per game in rushing last year, is expected to be the Savages' big gun in 1965. Stanton, a senior, was an all-Evergreen Conference back last year, all-state small college 'back of the year' and was ranked 14th nationally in rushing among small college backs.
