





Eastern Washington State College is one of six four year public institutions of higher education in the state. It is located at Cheney, Washington, 16 miles southwest of Spokane. It provides a liberal arts, general education program with majors in 52 areas.

With roots reaching back to pre-staethood days, Eastern Washington State College is the oldest of the four-year colleges, but forward-looking leadership in course offerings, facilities and philosophy has kept it in the forefront of service to students and the com-

Eastern's roots extend back to Benjamin P. Cheney Academy which opened its doors April 3, 1882.

In 1890, the trustees of the academy donated the building and eight acres of land to the state for training of teachers. The State normal school at Cheney first started classes October 13, 1890.

After 47 years as the Cheney State Normal School, the name was changed to Eastern Washington College of Education in 1937. The legislature approved, in 1961, the name Eastern Washington State College.

A multi-purpose, co-educational institution, E.W.S.C. sees its role in education as fulfilling the following

five functions:

1. Liberal education in the arts and sciences leading to the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Sciences degree.

2. Teaching education for elementary and secondary teachers leading to the Bachelor of arts in Education dearee.

3. Graduate work leading to the Masters of Arts or Master of Science degree with majors in selected area.




Eastern's Coaching Staff

Coach John Massengale begins his tenth year of coaching, his fourth year at Eastern. He was an assistant coach under head coach Brent Wooetn in the '69 and '70 football seasons. In 1971 he took over the head coaching reins.

Massengale received his bachelor of science degree from Northwest Missouri State University in '63 and went to Illinois State University to get his Master of Science in 1965. He played offensive tackle and defensive end for Northwest Missouri and was an assistant coach at the Illinois State laboratory high school in '64. He received his Doctorate of Education from University of Mexico in '69. He was an assistant coach for the wide receivers and linebackers at the University of Mexico in '67. After his doctorate degree, Massengale came to Eastern.

Massengale coached the Eastern team to a 5-5 season and a third place in the EVCO in '71 in his first year as head coach. Last year the Eagles were plagued with injuries with eight starters sidelined. The Eagles only managed a 3-7 season, with five games that could have gone either way. In his two years as head coach, Massengale has had two All-Americans in Mel Collins and Bob Picard.

This season Massengale started team practice with three-a-day during the first weeks to prepare them for oen of the tighest conference races the Evergreen has ever had.

TODAYS GAME

Today's game with Oregon College is the sixth meeting of the two teams in the history of both schools. In 1931 they tied 19-19 with Oregon College coming back in 1932 to nip Eastern 18-6. The two teams didn't play again until 1970 when Eastern downed them 34-20. In 1971, OCE defeated Eastern 28-16 and again last year, 13-6.

The Eagles of EWSC come from a 3-7 season last year. Injuries plagued last year's squad with eight starters sidelined. With a much healthier team this year, Coach John Massengale feels that the Eagles have as much of a chance at the EVCO title as any other team. "There appears to be no weak team in the conference this year and no team strong enough to completely dominate the season," Massengale said. "Every game played this year in the EVCO is close enough to go either way."

The Eagles return 20 lettermen with defense being the strong point of the team. Six starters return with the defense for the Eagles, including a letterman at every defensive position. Joe Ortlof and Al Bushnell return on the defense as All-Conference picks last year. Bushnell and Ortolf won the rare "black helmet" award last year for their outstanding and devestating hitting. Bushnell comes back at middle linebacker and Ortolf at Safety.

Another All-Evco returnee is Scott Garske as offensive tight end. Garske caught 42 passes for 595 yds. and four touchdowns last year. At 6-4, 240, Garske also adds punch as a blocking lineman. He is also the punter and kicker for the Eagles, averaging 40 yds. a punt.

Oregon College brings with them a talented two year letterman in quarterback Tom Horn and a three year veteran Doug Trice in the backfield. Henry Tautfest returns as fullback while two year lettermen Steve Rusell and Mike Rooney are at the end positions.

Both teams host a strong defense. Oregon's Larry Lockett and Terry Watkins, three year lettermen, will hold down the tackle positions while Tim Hundley returns as an all-conference middle linebacker.

Eastern's Dave Curtis moves from quarterback to the defensive secondary to strengthen the pass defense. Replacing Curtis at quarterback will be Bob Snow who transfers from Olympic Community College. Snow will be throwing to Mike McLendon at the split end

position. McLendon replaces little All-American Bob Picard who now is a Philadelphia Eagle. Steve Farrington comes back as flanker. John O'Connor and Dale Birchler are fully recovered from last year's injuries and return in the backfield.

Lettermen Jim Withrow, a 6-2, 240 defensive end will be an Eagle to watch as well as Randy Gorman at guard. Roy Abshire, an All-Conference pick transfer from Yakima Valley CC. Offensive linemen Rod Pettit, Dan Close, Dave Carter will take on the blocking roles. Doug Orcutt, Chris Knight, will give Oregon offensive line a match. Jim Witrow and Scott Grabenhorst secure down the defensive end positions. John Daniels and Ray Ericksen field the tough linebacking positions. Mike Richter and Chet Cockrill will toughen the passing defense in the secondary.

The Associated Press chose Oregon College to win the EVCO this year so Coach Masengale is well prepared. "I expect that this will be a very close game," Massengale said. "The las ttwo years they have won by a very close margin."

To prepare for today's game, Massengale's team has prepared against all the offensive formations Oregon has used in the last two years.





Bill McArthur, beginning his 28th year as O.C.E. head football coach, expects 38 lettermen to give him an edge in experience over most of his nine foes this season. Eight of these have lettered for three years and 11 are two year veterans.

The Wolves missed capturing the Evergreen title last year by the margin of a 32-26 loss to Central Washington, the eventual champion. In 1971, the Wolves wound up third in the conference.


The Wolves will be led offensively by two-year letterman quarterback Tom Horn of Sweet Home and the La Grande superball, 157 pound tailback Doug Trice, a three-year veteran. Henry Tautfest, two-year vet from Silverton returns at fullback. Split end Steve Russell and wide receiver Mike Rooney, both two-year lettermen from Grant High, will be Horn's primary targets, replacing the graduated Steve McElravy.

The steady Mike Hyder, three-year veteran from McMinnville, will hold down the center position again, however. Defense has been the strong point of McArthurs team for years. Everything is solid again this year, except for a vacancy at one end. Three-year men Larry Lockett of Astoria and Terry Watkins of Sweet Home will be back at tackle, and will have strong backing there. Tim Hundley, all-conference, all-district middle linebacker, will return with some help from ohter lettermen.

In the backfield, cornermen John Smith of Wilson High and Jat Milton of McMinnville will join safety Mark Ferris of Reynolds. All are three-year veterans. The fourth backfield man, one-year letterman safety Dave Flitcraft, is the brother of Jack Flitcraft, who was a Little All-American at safety last year.

First of a Series

New HPERA Facilities At Eastern

The new recreational facilities at EWSC, called Phase I and Phase II or HPERA Facilities, are part of a total construction phasing to meet the needs of an expected 7,500 students, the college's projected enrollment in a few years. Phase III and Phase IV have to be built, but are in construction stages. The phasing has been planned to reflect Eastern's most urgent needs. Phase I answers this need in classroom, administrative and research facilities. Phase II houses badly needed recreational and PE facilities. Phase III will provide the needed area to accommodate large numbers of people for veiwing games and other activities. Phase IV will provide aquatic facilities for the expanding aquatic program.



The HPERA facilities lie directly west of Washington Street across from Cheney Hall and the Hall of Sciences. It is bounded generally on the south by the large playfield and tennis courts and to the north by Woodward Stadium. The facilities are close to the surrounding campus and the large parking lots serve all recreation facilities including Woodward Stadium.

Phase I of the facilities was built in 1970. The lower level houses four classrooms, two lecture rooms, a student work

and study room, a lecture hall, a human performance lab and a corrective therapy room. The upper level contains an athletic workroom, a conference room, an intramural office and 40 other administrative offices.

The ground floor level permits an ease of access for heavy equipment. Wheel chair and other students can take advantage of the laboratory facilities through this lower level.



A large hallway greets people entering into Phase II through the lower level. Locker rooms serving men's and women's PE dominate the lower level. From either the men's or women's locker room, easy access is gained to all other facilities. A student may check-out necessary equipment from the storage and issue room and proceed out the doors to the other HPERA Buildings.






