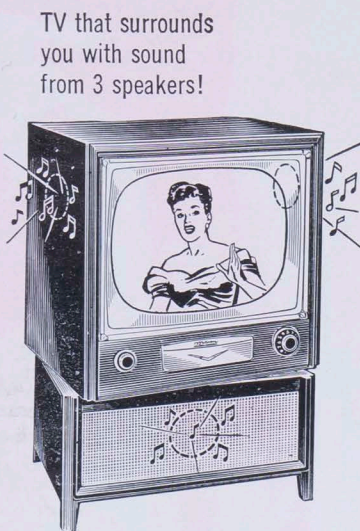

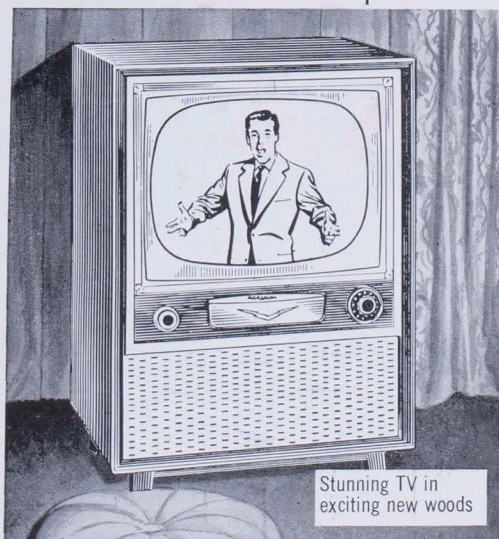

EASTERN WASHINGTON BRITISH COLUMBIA

The Eastern Washington Savages will be looking for their first victory and their first touchdown of the 1954 season tonight at Woodward Field as Coach Ed Chissus' squad hosts the University of British Columbia Thunderbirds from Vancouver.

The Savages lost to Whitworth 27-0 two weeks ago in the season opener and dropped an 18-0 decision to College of Puget Sound last Saturday to open the current Evergreen conference battle. However, the high-spirited Savages played good ball in both games. Their inability to score and a weak passing attack are the two big drawbacks.

British Columbia has yet to win a game this season, losing their opener to McGill at Montreal and then dropping games to the strong, independent Seattle Ramblers and Pacific Lutheran. The Lutes had to put out everything they had while downing the Boombirds 6-0 last week. The Vancouver crew is looking for an upset tonight and would like to beat Eastern.

In past meetings, Eastern has won all three games played between the two teams. The two teams inaugurated the series in 1950 at Vancouver with Eastern winning that one, 34 to 0.

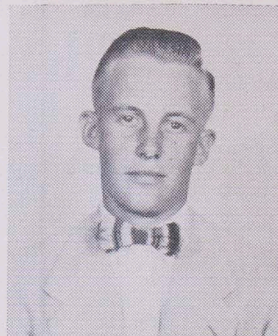
Willard Julum

Most experienced player on this year's Eastern football squad, Julum has lettered three years at tackle. Julum, one of the most popular guys on campus, is also Associated Student Body president and maintains a B-plus grade point average. Julum was named to the all-conference second team last year and is expected to earn first team laurels this fall.



Eugene Siegel

Out last season because of scholastic ineligibility, this 240-lb. tackle has teamed up with Julum to give Eastern two of the finest linemen in the Evergreen. Siegel lettered as a frosh in 1952 and his return to the Savage line has strengthened it considerably. Siegel was a 3-sport star in prep school at Metaline Falls. Extremely fast for a big man, he is expected to rate Evergreen honors.



Ray Koziuk

Koziuk, a two-year letterman halfback, comes from Chewelah, but transferred to Eastern after lettering for Coach Phil Sarboe's Humboldt State team at Arcata, California. Koziuk is a fine runner for a small player, but really stands out as a defensive back. He had very few equals in that department last fall and was second in the league in pass interceptions.



Myron Rasmussen

This speedy junior halfback is one of the fastest men in the conference when it comes to football or track. "Ras" broke away on a punt return against UBC last fall and romped 72 yards for a T-D, out-running the entire Thunderbird team. He holds the Evergreen conference $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile record and represented in that event at the national meet, Texas, as a frosh.

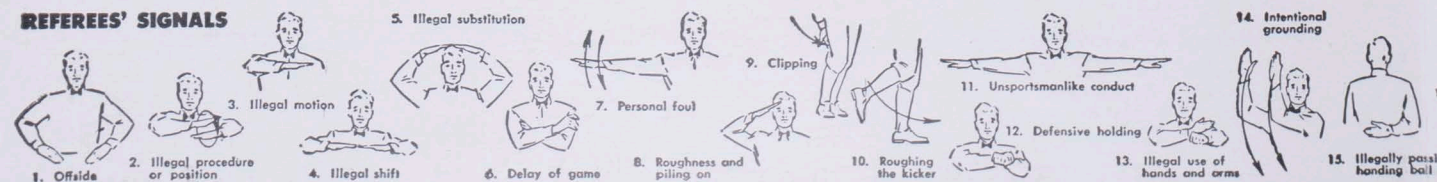

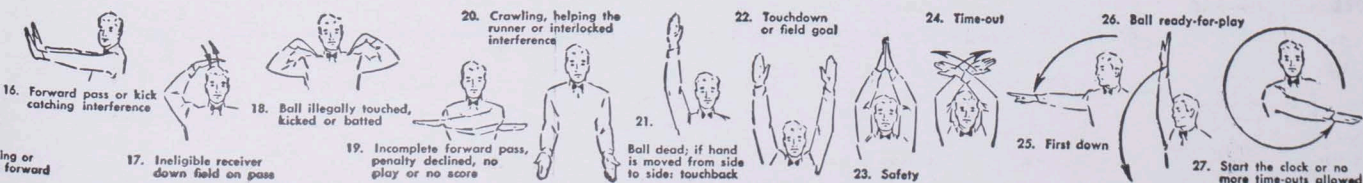
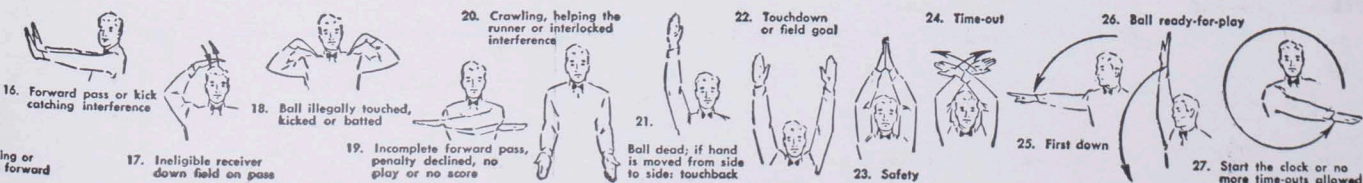

Thunderbirds Seek Upset Victory

The University of British Columbia Thunderbirds will have upset on their minds tonight at Woodward Field here in Cheney where they run head-on into the Eastern Washington Savages. British Columbia's much-improved squad came close to dumping Pacific Lutheran last weekend and will be "up" for their meeting with the Savages.

Coach Don Coryell, a graduate of the University of Washington, has ten lettermen back, including all-conference guard Bob Brady with which to form the nucleus of this year's team. Biggest losses from last year's team which won two and lost seven include quarterback Gordy Flemons, guard Cece Taylor and frosh halfback Jack Hutchinson who quit school to play for the professional Vancouver Lions.

Brady, a senior from Brockville, Ontario, is a two-year letterman and also captain of the British Columbia football squad. Brady, an inspiration to his teammates and an aggressive hard-driving lineman, is expected to give Eastern ball carriers a rugged time tonight when they run in his direction.

Gerry Stewart, a junior from Regina, Saskatchewan, will handle the quarterbacking duties for the Boombirds. A good ball handler, passer and kicker, Stewart is also a fine defensive ball player, responsible for a great deal of UBC tackles. Clutch player Ross Rayment will start at one of the halves with Jim Boulding certain to see action at the fullback slot. All three are lettermen and are plenty capable ball players.

MEET THE COACHES GENE BADGLEY

Gene Badgley comes to Eastern from Corvallis, Oregon, where he coached high school athletics for four years. Preceding his tenure at Corvallis, Badgley coached three years at Philomath, Oregon. Genial Gene will assist Red Reese in basketball and coach baseball in addition to his duties as line coach for the Savages.

Gene is originally from Pleasantville, Ohio, where he was a great high school athlete. He went to college at Simpson college in Indianola, Iowa and played basketball, baseball and football for three years before he went into the army.

The infantry occupied Gene for the next five years, mostly in the European campaign. Badgley rose to the rank of captain while in the army. A severe leg wound which he sustained in Europe earned him the Purple Heart, among other decorations.

That leg wound practically spelled the end of Badgley's college athletic career. He finished his college at the U. of Colorado in Boulder and despite the leg injury, managed to play baseball. He graduated in 1947 with a BS degree in physical education.
