ED CHISSUS-Head Coach

Beginning his seventh year as head coach at Eastern, Ed Chissus welcomes a squad with little depth and experience, but some outstanding ball players.

Big Ed, who began his football career as a tackle for Eastern in his undergraduate years, was a successful high school coach in the Yakima valley before assuming his duties at Eastern. His high school teams won 55 and lost 21 while winning or tying for the Valley championship seven times during the seven years he coached in that league.

In the past six years at Eastern his football squads have compiled a record of 25 wins, 22 losses and 2 ties. His teams have always been noted for their tough defensive play and last year led the conference in total defense, were third in total offense and finished fourth in the conference standings.

Traditionally, Chissus teams have used the split-T offense, but this year's squad will run from the slot back-T and provide a more wide open and varied attack.

FRANK SMITH-Assist. Coach

A former Olympic junior college and Canadian professional football player, Frank Smith joins the Eastern coaching staff after a successful two years' coaching in the Vancouver, B. C., Junior league.

Smith, who was a junior college all-star in 1952, played four years of high school football at Vancouver College prep prior to attending Olympic junior college in 1951.

He entered the Canadian pro Western

league in 1953 as an offensive guard and linebacker for the Calgary Stampeders and played for the Edmonton Eskimoes when they won the Canadian professional championship in 1954.

Smith retired from the professional ranks and entered coaching after an early season injury in 1957.

Here at Eastern Smith will handle the line coaching duties and assist head coach Chissus in the defensive department.

1959 PROSPECTS

The Savages have lost five of last year's 11 starters via graduation and have only 13 lettermen on hand for this season. They include all-conference first team selection Bill Palmer, tackle, and honorable mention picks Alfons Alt, linebacker, and Ted Schultz, guard.

Other returning starters include Rich Hilty, center; Ron Lehtola, guard; Gary Fuller, end and Jess Smith, fullback.

Veteran reserve backs Jack England, Tom Meier, Stan Rhodes and Joe Evans are expected to provide needed speed and power for the new slot back-T offense.

The line will be strong but will lack adequate reserve strength. The season will depend on how well the freshmen and transfers perform and how many key injuries occur among the veterans.

Coach Ed Chissus said he feels Eastern will be strong offensively with the ability to score often, but will be weaker defensively than in the past because of lack of depth and size in the line.

ALFONS ALT, Linebacker, 5'9", 195, Bonners Ferry, Idaho

Junior center, honorable mention All-Conference 1958. One of last year's outstanding defensive ball players, Al plays a rugged, steady game. In addition to defense duties, Al will probably place-kick and kick-off for the team.

RALPH BYQUIST, Guard, 5'11", 193, Seattle

A junior in elegibility, Byquist transfers from Everett JC with a reputation as a tough, agile lineman. He is a hard blocker, tough on defense and has the needed speed to play in the slot back-T offense.

MARVIN R. CARROLL, Tackle, 6'2", 210, Colfax

A frosh tackle from the undefeated Bulldogs of Colfax high school. Carroll was a slow starter, but is showing varsity ability with his blocking and defensive play.

GARY CONNER, Tackle, 6', 215, Walla Walla

A junior, two-year letterman, Conner is expected to be one of the stalwarts of this year's line. He is big, aggressive and has the experience to become a tough defensive tackle.

PAUL LERCH, Guard, 5'11", 175, Spokane A sophomore up from last year's JV squad,

Lerch is making a strong bid for a varsity berth this year. Small for a lineman, Lerch has a tremendous amount of desire and hustle to combat the larger boys.

RON LEHTOLA, Guard, 5'8", 220, Spokane

A strong stocky guard from Rogers high school, Lehtola has played two years of varsity ball for the Savages. He was a starter most of last season and is expected to see full-time duty again this year.

LARRY LIBERTY, End, 5'11", 170, Sunnyside

A sophomore up from the JV squad, Liberty is expected to be a competent reserve end this season. He blocks well and displays a lot of desire.
