Dear Father:

We have orders to move on the boats immediately I suppose (but of course do not know) that we will land near New Orleans and go into camp to await further orders.

I am quite well to-day but am weak as I have had the diaoreea two or three days but not to-day.

In the explosion of the amunition boat here this week, none of our Co. were much hurt though twelve of them were there loading amunition that day and two of them were on the boat when the first shell exploded. It is a miracle how they all escaped but they did. One of our Reg. was killed and one seriously wounded.

Tom Sterling and Aq. Turner were sent up the river sick this week past. Neither of them were very sick but were not able for duty and it was hoped they will get home to get able for service again.
