BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

July 8, 1925.

A meeting of the board of trustees was held on the above date. Those present: Mary A. Monroe, Chas. P. Lund and Chas. E. Myers. H. N. Stronach was present as secretary.


On account of complaints of trouble and nuisance from agents and solicitors about halls and campus for the purpose of selling or taking orders from students a motion was made by Senator Myers and seconded by Mr. Lund that:

" No agents or solicitors be permitted in any buildings on the campus for the purpose of showing, selling or taking orders from students; provided however, that this be not construed as a bar to regular exhibits from text book publishing houses in the Administration Building of the Normal School. "

Payment of Tull & Gibbs voucher for furnishings for Monroe Hall in the amount of \$ 1014.00 was approved.

The status of Mr. Baldwin was discussed and it was decided that Mr. Baldwin be notified that his services with the Cheney Normal School be terminated and the secretary was authorized to communicate this fact to him in accordance with the draft of letter by Mr. Lund, Chairman.

Meeting adjourned.

Dear Sir:

At a recent meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Cheney Normal School your communication of June 26th addressed to Dr. A. R. Lang, Education Department, State Normal School, Cheney, was considered.

It is quite apparent that your attitude toward the president of the school is such that it will be impossible for you to give that measure of loyalty to, and cooperation with, the president that should characterize the relations between a member of the faculty and the head of the institution.

Every member of the board expressed the opinion that you had many splendid qualities which should bring you success in the teaching profession, and it is with some regret that we found it necessary to take the definite action of which you are now advised.

In the circumstances the board adopted a resolution that your services with the Cheney Normal School be terminated and the Secretary be requested to communicate this fact to you.
