BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING


The Board of Trustees of the Eastern Washington College of Education met Wednesday noon, September 28, at the Davenport Hotel at twelve o'clock. Present: James P. Dillard, Joel E. Ferris, Richard S. Munter, and R. T. Hargreaves.

LIBRARY: Mr. Hargreaves presented a letter from the contractor, Mr. J. T. Halin, asking that he be granted permission to pay his men by check. The request was approved by the Board and signed by the chairman, Mr. Munter.


After considerable discussion the Board approved the recommendation of the architect, Mr. Rasque, that Mr. Lester W. Richet be employed by the Trustees as their inspector on the library construction job, at a salary of \$225.00 a month beginning October 1, with the provision that Mr. Rasque furnish the Board with a statement of Mr. Richet's qualifications and experience, with the further understanding that Mr. Richet shall not be on Mr. Rasque's payroll while he is acting as inspector for the College.

PRESIDENT'S RESIDENCE: Mr. Hargreaves brought up for the consideration of the Board the matter of increasing the size of the kitchen at the President's Residence, because it is entirely inadequate for institutional entertainment purposes. The Board instructed him to get estimates on the extension and improvement of the kitchen facilities.

FIRE ESCAPES: The Board voted unanimously to instruct the Union Iron Works to install two fire escapes in the rear of Sutton Hall at a cost of \$395.00.
