## **Chris Grant**

Chris Grant is a percussionist, composer and music educator residing in Spokane Valley, WA. Chris has completed degrees in Music (2002) and Music Education (2003) from Eastern Washington University. He has taught music at the Kindergarten through collegiate level. His concert and jazz bands at Riverside High School received the "Most Outstanding Band" award at the Columbia Basin College Jazz Unlimited festival in both 2004 & 2005. Chris presently instructs the Thunder Drum & Bugle Corps, Spokane Youth Symphony, Gonzaga University Drumline, and teaches courses at Eastern Washington University.

Chris is an active arranger and composer of percussion, band, and string literature. His arrangements have been performed by many Washington High Schools such as Mead, Newport, Mt. Spokane, Cascade, Ferris and Central Valley, as well as Belleville (Virginia), Ashley Ridge (South Carolina), and Waccamaw (South Carolina). Chris has also served as an arranger for the Gonzaga University Pep Band, Spokane Youth Symphony, Eastern Washington University Marching Band, Cascade Drum & Bugle Corps, and Thunder Drum & Bugle Corps.

As a performer, Chris is a sought after percussionist. Chris presently plays with the Coeur d'Alene Symphony, is a board member and performer with the Spokane British Brass Band, and plays drumset for Kari Marguerite and the 76, Pink Tango, The Working Spliffs, and The Rhythm Commission amongst others. Chris has also performed with the Omak Symphony, Tuxedo Junction Big Band, Milonga, Jazz Northwest, Straight-Ahead Jazz Quartet, and Idaho-Washington Symphony.

Chris is a member of the Percussive Arts Society (PAS) and the National Association for Music Education (NAFME). Chris proudly plays Pro-Mark sticks and mallets. Chris is available for percussion lessons (orchestral snare, rudimental percussion, drum set, keyboard percussion, accessory percussion), as well as music theory and beginning band instruments.

## **Brian Van Winkle**

Brian Van Winkle is a composer, conductor, and euphoniumist from Puyallup, WA who currently lives in Cheney, WA. He received his B.M. in Composition from Eastern Washington University in 2005, where he studied with Jonathan Middleton, and his M.M. in Composition from Central Michigan University in 2007, where he studied composition with David Gillingham and José Luis Maúrtua. While there, he also studied rehearsal and score study techniques with Jack Williamson.

Since returning to EWU to pursue a Masters in Music Education, Brian has been teaching music theory and composition courses in addition to conducting the symphonic band and leading the EWU Tuba Euphonium choir. In addition to these activities he has written many arrangements for EWU's new basketball pep band Code Red, is working on a number of commissions for original works, plays euphonium in the EWU wind ensemble, and has been sought after as a private low brass instructor and adjudicator/clinician in the area.

## **Patrick Winters**

Patrick Winters is the Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Eastern Washington University where he conducts the EWU Wind Ensemble, teaches conducting, and courses in music education. Mr. Winters combines his broad experience as a university conductor and teacher with his experience as a successful high school director. His high school ensembles in Virginia and California achieved an impressive record of competitive and festival performances, as well as tours through the eastern and western United States, Canada, Mexico and Japan. Mr. Winters has established a band program at Eastern Washington University that is one of the finest and most active in the Northwest. Concert, marching and jazz groups regularly perform throughout the Northwest United States and Western Canada. His EWU Wind Ensemble's compact discs CELEBRATIONS and DANCES, SONGS & CELEBRATIONS have received wide acclaim. The group can also be heard on SOUNDSCAPES, PRISMS and MILLENIUM CD, the EWU Music Department's three compact discs. In 1994, Mr. Winters received the PTI Outstanding Faculty Award for excellence in teaching. In 1998, he was awarded the Washington Music Educator's Association Outstanding Music Educator Award. In 2000, he was inducted into the W.M.E.A. Hall of Fame. Mr. Winters' article Building Ensemble Musicianship For Your Concert Band appears in "Spotlight On Teaching Band," published by M.E.N.C.

Mr. Winters holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Elon University and a Master of Music Education degree from California State University. Mr. Winters is in demand throughout the country as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator, having appeared in 16 states and 5 foreign countries. Patrick lives in Spokane, Washington with his wife Joyce and their three children Brittany, Danica, and Zach.

## **Luke Brockman**

A native of Seattle, Washington, Luke recently joined the faculty of Eastern Washington University as the Assistant Director of Bands. Luke is an alumnus of both Western and Eastern Washington Universities, holding a M.A. in Jazz Pedagogy from EWU and a B.A. in Music and a M.I.T from WWU.

As an active performer and teacher in both classical and jazz idioms, Luke performs with the Spokane Jazz Orchestra and Bob Curnow Big Band. He has given clinics and masterclasses for the EWU Jazz Dialogue Festival, EWU Band Invitational, EWU Jazz Dialogue Summer Camps, and at various middle and high schools in the area. Luke recently became a director in the Spokane All-City Jazz Ensemble program where he teaches jazz improvisation and small group jazz to middle and high school students. This summer, Luke will be the director and coordinator of the EWU Jazz Dialogue High School summer camp.
