Tonight we are delighted to feature the extraordinary talents of trombonist/composer, Paul McKee. Upon graduation, he immediately joined the Woody Herman Orchestra, where he performed for 4 years and appeared on three albums, two of which were nominated for Grammy Awards. In addition, he arranged and composed for Woody's band and other professional, college, and high school jazz ensembles. He has given recent clinics in California, Washington, Texas, and New Hampshire in addition to being a featured performer at the 1989 National Association of Jazz Educators' annual convention in San Diego, California. He is currently a freelance performer, teacher and composer in Austin.
